


Unprecedented growth of maritime trade & challenges of ports

- World Maritime Trade
 - Increased by 110% from 1980 to 2007 (3.70 to 7.88 billion tons)
- World Container Traffic
 - Increased by 1200% from 1980 to 2007 (37 to 481 million TEU)
- World Ports' Challenges in response to globalization
 - Technological containerization
 - Institutional port privatization
 - Business model port as logistics center rather than interface between sea and land transport



Faster Growing Intra-East Asia Trade

(X.XX) = growth rate from 2000 to 2007 compiled by MOL data




Economic Crisis & After....


- Immediate impacts: historical decline of world trade
 & port throughputs
 - Preparing for economic recovery by port improvements
- Fundamental impacts: Re-orientation of social & economic principles
 - Reassessing industrial activity in more balanced way (transport distance, cost, environment)
 - Shifting to more sustainability-oriented
 - Production moves closer to end markets
